CUFFS AND COLLARS— FUCK BUTTONS BLAST THEIR NIHILISTIC BEAT WAY PAST 11

"WE", SAYS ANDREW Hung of Fuck Buttons, "ussound fascists", Ast the name of his band suggests, he isn't entirely serious or indeed accuster - f a controversal label must be applied to its approach to sound it's clearly "write-noise supermodats." Formed in Bistol 2004, the duo, consisting of Hung and Benjamin John Power, plays what Hung describes as "nihilatic noise," a ferodous mix of done, shreepes and noise docing.

Like most successful facility, they are disclarful of the practical convention of their contemporates. Among their many lipidips and electronics, the pair's only tradtional instruments are chargly-stop-field they sell or closely bord, broken and vieed through debatrion people. Woods, when they appear, are discharted beyond excognition. Though Ben lists only "the loud and the file?" as an influence, they are dealiny caught commentme to believe thy Bloody Vielentine and Surin Oliii. Fuck Buttons sound like God blowery in nose in slaw more law.

What sets Fuck Buttors apart is an ability to express this sweeping atraction as euphorise, not deepf. The more simple "Bright Tomorrow" starts with a street, sheed-metal of bedocksic, then opens up into a yawning chasm. A melody is eventually revealed, a simple battered musery thyme that respects throughout. "There's definitely an emotional element to it," says Andy, "An idealism." This idealism is amplified beyond belief through a live sound system. On stage, is song each other over a table messy with gadgetry, the two perform more by feliepathy than eye contact, creating a deliefering noise that recordes with capture, dopped scorems. Es simulatineously upitting and chacks, a brane half-og, half-outh attroofbee that levers the audience from between during and covering their ears. As Ben says, they play "as load as It" on?"

Having guit their day jobs and signed to ATP Recordings, 2008 is looking increasingly bright for the boys, with their debut LP. Street Horrising, out this month. Produced by members of Part Chimp and Mogwal, it is sure to be as loud as it is wend.
